



Amendments to the Energy Community Treaty – Reciprocity Mechanism (Art. 25)



Creating the basis for a new reciprocity mechanism under the Treaty regime by the Introduction of new Article 25 "Reciprocity" in combination with Annex V

- The Ministerial Council may adopt binding provisions by which the provisions listed in Annex V will be binding between Contracting Parties and the European Union (Art. 25 (1))
- Annex V Art. 3 includes Regulation (EU) 2017/1938 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 25 October 2017 concerning measures to safeguard the security of gas supply and repealing Regulation (EU) No 994/2010, with the exception of Article 13
- Measures taken under Article 25 require a positive vote of the European Union (Art. 81)

Requirements of the new Art. 25`(1)



The provisions listed in Annex V are binding only under the following conditions:

- Indispensable to the achievement of the goals of the Treaty of the EnC
- Are of cross-border character between the EU and one or more CP
- No excessive financial implications
- Not disclosing confidential information
- No creation of solidarity obligations as referred to in Art. 13 of Regulation (EU) 2017/1938

Safeguards (new Art. 25' (3) - (5) ECT) - Cooperation between EU and Energy Community



Safeguards (new Art. 25' (3) - (5) **ECT**)

- The European Union shall have the power to determine when to enact mutual rights and obligations based on the efforts of the CP in implementation and enforcement (Art. 3)
- Unilateral European Union decision to "switch on" / "switch off" mutual rights and obligations defined in the Ministerial Council decision (Art. 4)
- The concerned CP and the Secretariat shall receive a notice in advance except in cases of urgency
- The assessment of the European Union shall be based on any potential breach of the internal energy market rules, rules in the field of environment Art 25′(4)

Unilateral EU decision to "switch on" / "switch off" mutual rights based on EU assessment



<u>Switch – On Methodology</u>

CP sufficiently demonstrating effective implementation and enforcement of its obligations:

- COM Proposal to the Council (EU) to enact mutual rights and obligations defined in the MC Decision
- EU Decision to enact, see new Art.
 25'(3) and (5)


Switch - Off Methodology:

CP not implementing and enforcing effectively its obligations:

- COM Proposal to the Council (EU) to suspend EU obligations
- Advance notice to the CP concerned and the Secretariat (except in cases of urgency), see new Art. 25'(4)
- EU Decision to suspend may be taken
 Art. 25'(4) and (5)

Reciprocal Obligations



Extension of the application of the regulation to the Contracting Parties of the Energy Community will include thanks to Art. 25:

- Risk assessment, preventive action plans, emergency plans
- Enabling reverse flows
- Commitment not to take measures that negatively impact security of supply of the neighbors
- Participation in the Gas Coordination Group on certain issues



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
