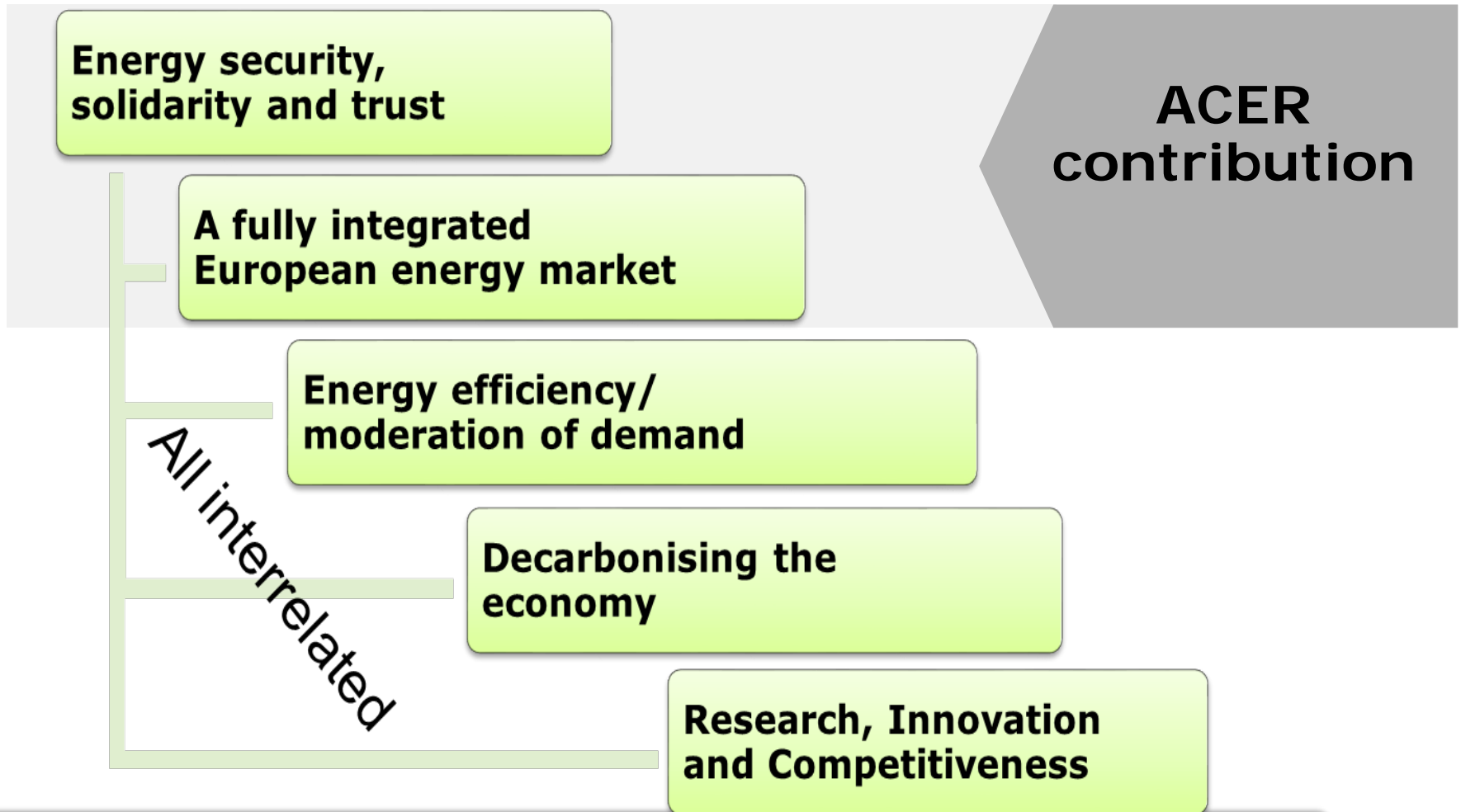


Reinforcement of ACER competences – a need for effective cross-border regul.

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Future development within the Energy Union
Its dimensions:



Why?

- For effective regulation of cross-border issues

In which areas?

- Oversight of ENTSOs and other Bodies
- Stronger NRAs Coordination in relation to cross-border infrastructure
- Market Monitoring

and

- Enhanced Cooperation with EnC

Oversight of ENTSOs and other Bodies

- Increasingly important role of ENTSOs and other Bodies with critical/monopoly IEM functions (e.g. NEMOs), requires effective oversight by ACER
- ACER to be able to issue binding decisions where appropriate and proportionate, for example in relation to:
 - Guidelines and Codes development and implementation
 - TYNDP process
 - Work programmes and related budget and expenditure
 - Statutes and Rules of procedure

Stronger NRAs Coordination

- ACER to replace NRAs in taking CACM 3rd-level decisions
 - when the decision is to be taken by unanimity within a time period, and
 - if the decision is not taken, the case is referred to ACER
- Mechanisms to further enhance cooperation and coordination among NRAs
- ACER to be allowed to issue “own-initiative”:
 - “Peer review” Opinions
 - Recommendations for Good Practices
 - Opinions on the application of Guidelines

Monitoring of Markets

- ACER to be given powers to require information from all EU energy-sector entities when needed for monitoring

Within the EU

- CBCA decisions in two cases
- NCs gradually implemented, monitoring started

Cooperation with Energy Community

- Progressing towards a workable solution on cross-border cases at the border EU - EnC
- Cooperation ACER – EnCS
