Prices quality reporting 2022 (p. 1/4)

- Quality reports on prices are submitted according to article 7(3) of Regulation (EU) 2016/1952
- 'Every three years, Member States shall provide the Commission (Eurostat) with a standard quality report on the data in accordance with the quality criteria laid down in Article 12(1) of Regulation (EC) No 223/2009. Those reports include information on the scope and collection of the data, the calculation criteria, the methodology and data sources used, and any changes thereto.'



Prices Quality reporting 2022 (p. 2/4)

 Article 7(1) legislates the application of the standard quality criteria laid down in Article 12(1) of Regulation (EC) No 223/2009, which states the quality assessment dimensions that apply to the data:

'relevance', which refers to the degree to which statistics meet current and potential needs of the users;

'accuracy', which refers to the closeness of estimates to the unknown true values;

'timeliness', which refers to the period between the availability of the information and the event or phenomenon it describes;



Prices Quality reporting 2022 (p. 3/4)

'punctuality', which refers to the delay between the date of the release of the data and the target date (the date by which the data should have been delivered);

'accessibility' and 'clarity', which refer to the conditions and modalities by which users can obtain, use and interpret data;

'comparability', which refers to the measurement of the impact of differences in applied statistical concepts, measurement tools and procedures where statistics are compared between geographical areas, sectoral domains or over time;

'coherence', which refers to the adequacy of the data to be reliably combined in different ways and for various uses.



Prices quality reporting 2022 (p. 4/4)

- Additional requirements regarding content of the quality report are laid down in Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/803 concerning the technical requirements regarding the content of quality reports on European statistics on natural gas and electricity prices 2016/1952 – reporting on quality management and data revision required
- Quality reporting should cover the full years elapsed since the date of the previous quality report: 2019, 2020 and 2021
- Deadline for submitting the quality reports: 15 June 2022



ESS Metadata Handler

- National quality reports are to be filled in using the application <u>ESS Metadata</u> <u>Handler</u>
- National data providers need to be granted access to ESS MH
- In case of problems in accessing the application or filling in your national file, please contact <u>Stavros.Lazarou@ec.europa.eu</u> and/or <u>Tena.Gnjatovic@ec.europa.eu</u>
- For each country, **two files** are ready in ESS MH and need to be edited: one for electricity prices and one for natural gas prices

Pre-filled content

- Many concepts are pre-filled with information that we know or assume to be true
- Pre-filled content can and should be edited if the information is incorrect/incomplete
- Concepts are also pre-filled with text in blue font these are instructions and should be deleted once the concept is filled in
- Make sure all blue text is deleted before sending the file for validation!

Legal basis

- Regulation (EC) No 1099/2008 on energy statistics, article 6(4) and 6(5)
- "4. Every five years, Member States shall provide the Commission (Eurostat) with a report on the quality of the data transmitted as well as on any methodological changes that have been made.
- 5. Within six months of receipt of a request from the Commission (Eurostat), and in order to allow it to assess the quality of the data transmitted, Member States shall send to the Commission (Eurostat) a report containing any relevant information concerning the implementation of this Regulation."

- Concepts are pre-filled with information submitted in the previous quality reporting cycle (2015)
- Information needs to be edited to reflect the situation for reference year 2020
- Quality reporting cycle 2022 covers two additional EU data collections:
 SHARES and Disaggregation of final energy consumption in households
- NO INSTRUCTIONS AS PRE-FILLED TEXT IN BLUE!!!
- GUIDELINES FOR FILLING IN A CONCEPT APPEAR WHEN HOVERING WITH THE MOUSE OVER THE "G" ICON NEXT TO CONCEPT NAME!
