Commission Regulation (EU) 2022/132 of 28 January 2022

amending Regulation (EC) No 1099/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council on energy statistics, as regards the implementation of updates for the annual, monthly and short-term monthly energy statistics





Adoption: 28 January 2022

Publication: 31 January 2022

Entry into force: 20 February 2022

Improving timeliness for annual data submission	2022	31/10/2023

Splitting final energy consumption in agriculture/forestry	2022	31/10/2023
CHP (Combined heat and power generation)	2022	31/10/2023
Split of transmission and distribution losses	2022	31/10/2023
Final energy consumption in data centres	2024	31/03/2026
Supply side of the mini-questionnaires	2022	31/05/2023
Remove M-1 oil and gas	January 2022 (first period that is not to be reported to Eurostat)	January 2022 (data for December 2021)

Derogations are possible on a case-by-case basis, as long as they are well justified, and for a limited period of time (up to max. 3 years)

Derogations requests discouraged for items were 2 years were already granted



Hydrogen

To report by October 2025. New questionnaires will include interactions with hydrogen and all countries need to report on the same basis at the same time.




Data centres

To report by end March 2026, equivalent to a 2.5 years derogation to all countries



Non-energy use of renewables

Data to report by October 2025 includes a single data point. Details are only for reference year 2027.
