Join our Carbon Pricing Training in 2022!

Carbon pricing has proven to play a key role in achieving meaningful greenhouse gas (GHG) emission reduction in the EU and in ensuring a level playing field, as energy markets become increasingly integrated. The EU may expect a similar level of decarbonization ambition and carbon price levels from trade partners in the power and energy-intensive industries in the near future. By adopting the Decarbonization Roadmap, the Energy Community recently set out its intention to make progress in agreeing to a carbon pricing system for its Contracting Parties.

The Energy Community Secretariat and Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH are proud to kick off their Carbon Pricing Training series in January 2022.

In the course of five webinar-style lectures, the Secretariat and GIZ will seek to improve Energy Community stakeholders' knowledge about the steps to take to design and implement carbon pricing schemes in their jurisdictions and the options available for managing and using related revenue streams.

The webinars aim to attract a wide range of stakeholders including Government decision makers, energy sector actors, academia as well as civil society and other interested stakeholders. The training sessions will be conducted by adelphi on behalf of GIZ. They are free of charge.
