“Katowice Rulebook - what’s next?”

organized by the Energy Community Secretariat and the College of Europe in Natolin
under the auspices of the COP24 Presidency

(12 September 2019, College of Europe in Natolin, Warsaw)

Katowice Rulebook is a robust set of guidelines designed to operationalize the climate change regime contained in the Paris Agreement. It promotes trust among nations that all countries are transparently contributing their differentiated share in addressing the common challenge of climate change, and thus it enables greater ambition globally. 196 governments and the European Union reached this landmark outcome at the COP24 in December 2018 under the auspices of the Polish Presidency of the UN Climate Change Conference representing the UN Eastern European Group.

Functioning together, the international system agreed in Katowice and national systems for implementing Paris Agreement offer a well-crafted governance for promoting and tracking progress in tackling climate change. Nevertheless, good laws are necessary, but not sufficient, for effective multi-level climate governance. Implementation remains a challenge as it assumes political support for action to combat climate change and its impacts and requires adoption of tailor-made strategies and approaches at national level enhanced by capacity building measures if necessary.

Climate change becoming the central issue of international and European policy makes it timely to bring the Energy Community contracting parties together to take stock of recent achievements of Katowice climate summit and identify steps forward in the lead up to the COP25 in Chile. Moreover, the participants will share their expectations toward the UNSG Climate Action Summit on 23 September 2019. The workshop will enable also to exchange on implementation approaches to be followed on the national level, and this discussion will be held in conjunction with climate related policies under the Energy Community framework.
