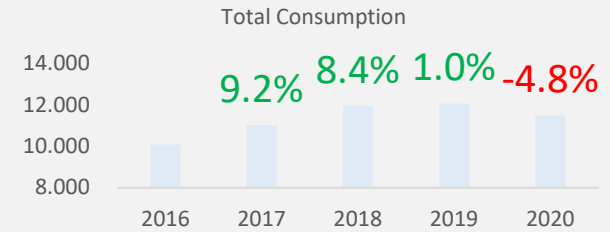

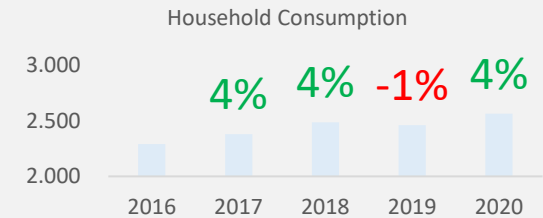
# Main Trends in Electricity Sector



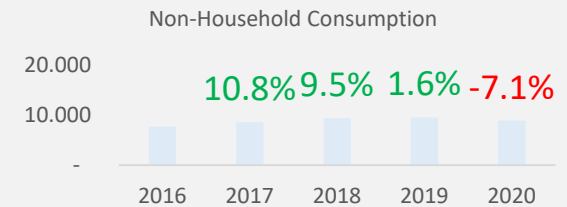
In comparison to 2019 in 2020 total consumption of electricity decreased by 4.8% and amounted 11,492 mln.kWh



In 2020 Household electricity consumption increased by 4% and reached 2,565 mln.kWh

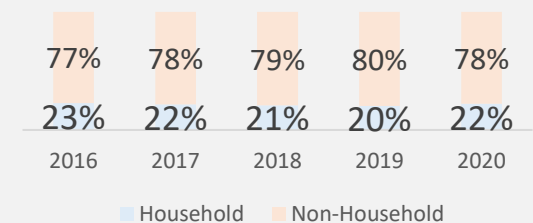


Non-Household electricity consumption decreased by 7.1% to 8,927 mln.kWh

Share of household consumption out of total consumption fluctuates in 20%-23%



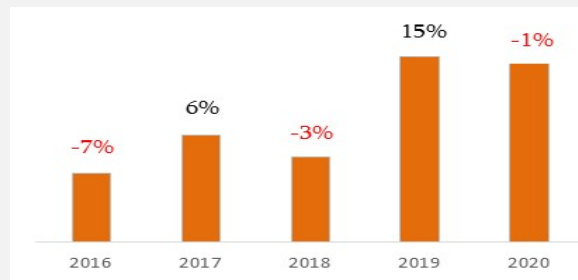


# Main Trends in Gas Sector

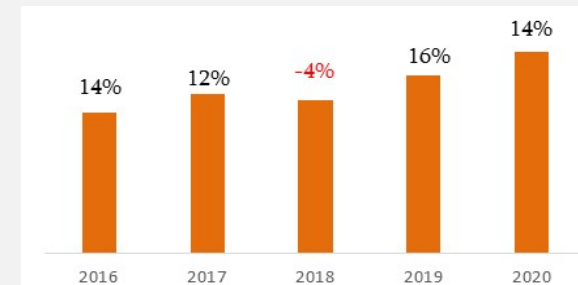
When Balance is Achieved



In 2020 the demand of Georgia for natural gas amounted 2,482 mln m3



Household consumption is increasing and it constituted 1,116 mln m3 (45%) in 2020



Consumption of gas filling stations amounted 137 mln m3 (6%)



Consumption of TPPs amounted 614 mln m3 (25%)

# Response to Pandemic

- Ordinary measures against COVID19
  - ✓ Distance work
  - ✓ Softening service quality standards
  - ✓ Other measures
- Due to the reduction of consumption, dispatch center had to impose generation reduction/water spilling schedules
- Due to the consumption decrease and other factors, electricity tariffs increased by approximately from 20 to 45 percentage
- Government subsidies
