EED 2012/27/EU

In charge for transposition: Ministry of Mining and Energy (MoME)

Current level of transposition of EED

- EED 2012/27/EU has been partialy transposed into the legislation of the Republic of Serbia since 2013 through:
 - The Law on efficient use of energy (2013-2021)
 - Various secondary legislation acts
 - Missing acts on Energy Audits: training of Energy Auditors and implementation of energy audits
 - The Law on Energy Efficiency and Rational Use of Energy (2021-)
 - Transposed consolidated versiono of EED (including amendments by Council Directive 2013/12/EU, Directive (EU) 2018/844, Directive (EU) 2018/2002, Regulation (EU) 2018/1999, Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/826 and Directive (EU) 2019/944)
 - Deadline prescribed by the Law for adoption of secondary regulation: October of 2022; for technical regulation April 2023
 - Development of secondary legislation in progress. Adopted so far:
 - The Rulebook on methodology for calculating the cumulative energy savings target ("Official Gazette of RS No. 96/21),
 - The Rulebook on methodology for calculation of the number of heating and cooling degree days ("Official Gazette of RS", No. 96/21),
 - The Rulebook on criteria for exemption of beneficiaries of funds from compulsory energy audit ("Official Gazette of RS", No. 39/21),
 - The Rulebook on methodology for calculating energy consumption indicators in road transport ("Official Gazette of RS", No. 98/21),



Ecodesign / Energy Labeling

Directive 2010/30/EU was transposed through:

 - Decree on energy-related products for which the indication of the consumption of energy and other resources is necessary ("Official Gazette of RS", No. 92/13, 80/16) and
 - 10 secondary legislation acts transposing labeling delegated acts

Directive 2009/125/EC and Regulation (EU) 2017/1369 have been transposed through:

- The Law on Energy Efficiency and Rational Use of Energy (2021-)
 - So far adopted:
 - The Decree amending Decree on energy-related products for which indication of the consumption of energy and other resources is necessary ("Official Gazette of RS", No. 41/21)

EPBD 2010/31/EU has been partialy transposed into the legislation of the Republic of Serbia since 2011 through:

- The Law on Planning and Construction,
 - Rulebook on Energy Efficiency of Buildings ("Official Gazette of RS" No. 61/11),
 - The Rulebook on the Conditions, Content and Method of Issuing Certificates of Energy Performance of Buildings ("Official Gazette of RS" No. 69/12 and 44/18).
- The Law on efficient use of energy (2013-2021) and The Law on energy efficiency and rational use of energy (2021-)
 - The Rulebook on Contolling of Heating Systems ("Official Gazette", of RS, No. 58/16)
 - The Rulebook on Controlling Air Conditioning Systems ("Official Gazette of RS", No. 82/16)
 - The Rulebook on Inspection of Heating Systems ("Official Gazette of RS", No. 87/21) NEW

EBRD Technical Assistance

- In order to improve the existing Regulation on energy efficiency in buildings and to establish the **full implementation** of the EPBD 2010/31/EU provisions, MCTI accepted **technical assistance** provided by **EBRD** through the **Regional Energy Efficiency Programme for the Western Balkans REEP Plus**, through amendments to existing by-laws for the following subcomponents:
 - Minimum Energy Performance Requirements (determination of new upgraded MEPR);
 - National Calculation Methodology (development of new upgraded NCM);
 - Energy Performance Certificates (improvement of existing EPC procedure);
 - Cost-optimality analysis for the residential buildings (development and provision of study);
 - Cost-optimality analysis for the non-residential buildings (development and provision of study provided by **GIZ DKTI EE Project**).
- The following have been prepared by REEP Plus team:
 - Final draft of National Calculation Methodology (NCM) 8th version submitted in September 2020 and
 - Final draft of Cost-optimality analysis for residential buildings 4th version submitted in November 2020. (this analysis has been provided based on two different methodology approaches, one according to REEP Plus team experts, and the another according to TWG).
 - Final draft of new Rulebook on Energy Efficiency of Buildings (1st version submitted in January 2021);
 - Final draft of new Rulebook on Energy Performance Certificates (1st version submitted in December 2020)

- **TWG had remarks** on these final draft versions of documents and advised MCTI not to implement them in the new rulebooks before the corrections are made.
 - Considering this TWG advice, MCTI has been seeking the adequate way to finalise activities on amending the Rulebooks for the purpose of lay down into the force.
 - In the meantime, in March 2021 EBRD notified MCTI that REEP Plus programme is concluded.

Further steps

- MCTI is in process of:
 - drafting amended Rulebooks using all documents submitted in technical support by REEP Plus program and by GIZ DKTI EE Project.
 - finding solution for **NCM** improvement and algorithm and national software development (for NCM implementation), because the new Rulebooks cannot be implemented without finalised methodology, developed algorithm and adequate software.
 - Considering the complexity of the methodology, algorithm and software development, **Serbia has adopted a new** deadline for the full implementation of the EPBD for the end of 2023.

Long-Term Strategy for Mobilizing Investments in Renovation of the National Building Stock

- MCTI began in 2019 to develop Long-Term Strategy for Mobilizing Investments in Renovation of the National Building Stock (further: LTRS) in accordance with Article 4 of Directive 2012/27/EU (respectively Article 2a of Directive 2010/31 / EU, and in conjunction with Article 53 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1999 on the Governance of the Energy Union and Climate Action):
 - The technical assistance for praparation of the Terms of Reference was provided by GIZ DKTI EE Project and international consultant BPIE (Buildings Performance Institute Europe) in November 2019;
 - The **National Consultant** has been elected in December 2019;
 - Due to COVID 19 pandemic, the first phase of document development (data collection) was prolonged to June 2020;
 - Final draft of LTRS was submitted in December 2020. After MCTI and inter-sectorial technical working group (TWG) revised this document and provided their comments, the new **final draft was submitted on 26th of April** 2021.
 - Considering the **Parliament** has **adopted in April several new Laws** from the filed of energy including LEERUE, new revision and correction of LTRS was needed.
 - After implementation of these new laws in LTRS, Public Debate was announced for the period from 10th of November to 30th November 2021.
 - Adoption of LTRS is expected for December 2021.
