AggregateEU – in a nutshell

Instrument set-up during energy crisis


- 2023/2024
- Successful participation by companies
- Additional avenue, not replacing markets

Who can buy

- EU27 & Energy Community (incl. Ukraine, Moldova)
- End consumers, gas traders, gas suppliers

Gas sellers

All except for Russia



Where we come from: EU Energy Platform and AggregateEU

Geopolitical and sectoral context

- Energy market disruption caused by Russia's invasion of Ukraine;
- Interruption of most imports of pipeline gas from Russia causing all-time high prices on gas markets.

Policy initiatives and objectives

- **REPowerEU Plan** increase EU's strategic resilience and phase out dependency on Russian gas through savings, clean energy and diversification;
- EU Energy Platform support diversification and security of supply through joint purchasing and international outreach;
- **Joint Purchasing** leverage the weight of EU single market to secure scarce supplies, support affordability and diversification, transparency and avoid competing among ourselves for scarce supplies.


Legal basis

- Solidarity Regulation adopted under Article 122 of TFEU December 2022;
- Extension of the Solidarity Regulation December 2023;
- Decarbonized Gases and Hydrogen Package May 2024.

Implementatio n timeline

- Adoption of legal basis December 2022;
- Contracting service provider January 2023;
- First round of demand aggregation and joint tendering April 2023.

Consolidated figures associated with the four rounds of tender in 2023 and the mid-term tendering round in 2024:





Horizontal considerations

Link with Financial institutions

Financial institutions partnering with the Platform to assess requests to provide financial support for gas purchases

Cooperation mechanisms

Central Buyers - act on behalf of companies to purchase gas

States (15% of storage targets)

Agent-on-behalf - provide services such as LNG regasification, transport to the point of consumption, or balancing services


